Introduction

To gather the statistics on the care provided by the Hospitaller Order of St John of God in 2014, questionnaires were circulated to 379 centres and facilities, of which 323 were returned completed, and 56 were ignored, Table 1 shows the breakdown by Province.

The following analysis therefore refers to the 323 centres that submitted the information through the dedicated website or by email or by post, Therefore covers 85 percent of the Order's centres, although this is the maximum coverage because certain items on the questionnaires submitted by some centres were left blank, even though the other items were answered.

278 centres gave us the following information on the type of ownership/management:

- 89% belong to the Order,
- 4% are jointly owned with other entities,
- 7% are being managed on behalf of another entity.

We have information on both the proprietorship/management and on the provision of care in 277 facilities, 64% of the facilities owned by the Order have a lay General Manager, while in 19% of the cases the General Manager is another Hospitaller Brother, and for the remainder it is the Community Prior (17%). In the jointly-owned centres 8% have a Hospitaller Brother as the General Manager, 92% a lay General Manager. Lastly, of the 19 facilities managed on behalf of another entity, 63% are headed by a lay person, 4% by another Hospitaller Brother, and 3% by the Community Prior.

The 379 centres and facilities break down as follows in terms of the category of care provided:

- A. 88 hospitals (85 questionnaires returned),
- B. 59 non-hospital (primary health care) facilities) (53 questionnaires returned)
- C. 61 centres for people with mental disabilities (56 questionnaires returned)
- D. 84 centres for people with physical, mental and sensorial disabilities (51 questionnaires returned),
- E. 44 centres for the elderly (38 questionnaires returned),
- F. 43 miscellaneous social-welfare facilities (40 questionnaires returned).

Diagram 1 Care facilities by care category, 2014




Day Hospitals, Day Surgeries, Day Care, outpatient units and pharmacies/herbalists

For care categories A, B and C it is only possible not only to count the number of 'ordinary admissions' but also treatments in Day Hospitals, Day Surgeries, Day Care centres as well as outpatient treatments.

In 2014, the Day Hospitals, Day Surgeries, Day Care centres admitted just under 300,000 guests (Tab. 6).

Over 18,000,000 outpatient treatments were provided in 2014 (Tab.7).

Diagram 3 Breakdown by type of employees by care category. 2014



Volunteers

The Order's centres have a total of 9,399 volunteer workers. Tables 13 and 14 show the breakdown of volunteers by province and care category.

The centres which replied report that OH volunteers are present at least once a week, for a total of 4,076 people, and 1,003 volunteers are present less than once a week.

1,996 volunteers belonging to other associations are present more than once a week, and 2,324 less than once a week. Fig. 4 shows the distribution of OH and non-OH volunteers in the five continents in which the Order operates.



Financing

43% of the funding received by the centres which replied to the questionnaire (251 out of 379) came from central government, local government or other public agencies, while 24% came from paying patients, companies, private insurance policies, 6.8% came from charity donations, and 5% came from Other sources.

With regard to the financing of investments resolved in 20143, the centres which replied reported that 41% of the funding came from revenues earned from from the services provided, 9% from government grants or from other public agencies, 3% from private contributions, and 11% from contributions made within the Order.

Twinnings

8% of the 253 centres which replied to the questionnaire said that they had established twinnings in 2014 with other centres of the Order, and only 3 facilities said that they had established twinning arrangements with other Provinces of the Order.
