INTRODUCTION

PILGRIM

We, the Sisters Hospitallers of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Hospitaller Brothers of Saint John of God, continue to join forces on this journey in synodality at the service of vocations. 2025 is a new year to be in communion with the Lord and with the people who wish to respond to the Lord's calling by pursuing a specific vocation.

This year has been proclaimed by Pope Francis as a Jubilee or Holy Year; the theme chosen for the Jubilee was "Pilgrims of Hope". This will be a special time to accompany humanity in so many situations of pain that the world is currently experiencing as a result of the crises that have taken place: the pandemic, wars, the effects of climate change, etc. In his Bull Spes non Confundit "Hope does not disappoint", Pope Francis invites everyone to be a sign of hope for the weakest, the poor, the incarcerated, the elderly and migrants. This Holy Yesar is a time to bring hope where there is no future, where strength is exhausted and life loses its meaning.

As we do every year, the Vocations Promotion and Formation Commissions of the Sisters and Brothers presented the prayer for hospitaller vocations document as a tool for all the communities to come together in prayer and ask the Lord of the harvest to send more vocations to the Hospitaller mission. The document has a simple structure: an introduction taken from the Pope's Bull; a hospitaller message that connects us with our mission and invites us to pray; a reflection from various formation communities around the world, in which they tell us how they are a sign of hope amid the crises we are experiencing worldwide; a number of daily prayers, and the final prayer, which invites us to ask the Lord that we may all be faithful witnesses of God's mercy and fraternity, and that he may generate vocations in our communities.

2025 is a special year for us to be attuned to all the emerging needs in our world, a year for us to walk together, to join forces and respond to so many situations of pain, but it is also a year to ask the Lord for vocations to hospitality. We invite you to pray with this document in communities and apostolic centers.

Monition

"Since we are justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing in the glory of God... Hope does not disappoint, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us" (Rom 5:1-2.5). That life becomes manifest in our own life of faith, which begins with Baptism, develops in openness to God's grace and is enlivened by a hope constantly renewed and confirmed by the working of the Holy Spirit.

By his perennial presence in the life of the pilgrim Church, the Holy Spirit illumines all believers with the light of hope. He keeps that light burning, like an ever-burning lamp, to sustain and invigorate our lives. Christian hope does not deceive or disappoint because it is grounded in the certainty that nothing and no one may ever separate us from God's love: "Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril or the sword? No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Rom 8:35.37-39). Here we see the reason why this hope perseveres in the midst of trials: founded on faith and nurtured by charity, it enables us to press forward in life. As Saint Augustine observes: "Whatever our state of life, we cannot live without these three dispositions of the soul, namely, to believe, to hope and to love".

Reflection

HOPE, A CRY OF FREEDOM FOR PRISONERS

TUESDAY 06

Monition

The freedom (...) This is an ancient appeal, one drawn from the word of God, whose wisdom remains ever timely. It calls for acts of clemency and liberation that enable new beginnings: "You shall hallow the fiftieth year and you shall proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants" (Lev 25:10). This institution of the Mosaic law was later taken up by the prophet Isaiah: "The Lord has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and release to the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour" (Is 61:1-2). Jesus made those words his own at the beginning of his ministry, presenting himself as the fulfilment of the "year of the Lord's favour" (cf. Lk 4:18-19). In every part of the world, believers, and their Pastors in particular, should be one in demanding dignified conditions for those in prison, respect for their human rights and above all the abolition of the death penalty, a provision at odds with Christian faith and one that eliminates all hope of forgiveness and rehabilitation. In order to offer prisoners a concrete sign of closeness, I would myself like to open a Holy Door in a prison, as a sign inviting prisoners to look to the future with hope and a renewed sense of confidence.

Our novitiate is in Yaoundé, the capital of Cameroon. Every Sunday we visit the city prison, which houses both men and women inmates. It is a powerful moment, full of emotion, because the wretchedness, injustice and abuse there touch us deeply. People are treated without dignity! We feel sadness, but also compassion and joy in reaching out to the inmates because our presence reassures and comforts them. They express the joy of sharing their experiences, and we dedicate our time to listening to them, encouraging them to live in faith, trusting in God who cares and loves us all. We also share meals and medicine with them and the celebration of the Eucharist. This space, where we encounter the pain of these individuals, enables us to experience God's mercy in our daily lives, where we discover his presence. He is there to accompany, heal, restore, lift and comfort us in times in which we feel most fragile. This experience makes us attentive and sensitive to the needs of our brothers and sisters

Signs of hope should also be shown to the sick, at home or in hospital. Their sufferings can be allayed by the closeness and affection of those who visit them. Works of mercy are also works of hope that give rise to immense gratitude. Gratitude should likewise be shown to all those healthcare workers who, often in precarious conditions, carry out their mission with constant care and concern for the sick and for those who are most vulnerable.

Inclusive attention should also be given to all those in particularly difficult situations, who experience their own weaknesses and limitations, especially those affected by illnesses or disabilities that severely restrict their personal independence and freedom. Care given to them is a hymn to human dignity, a song of hope that calls for the choral participation of society as a whole.

"It broke my heart to see them so poor and so mistreated" (1st D 155)

John did not have the resources to open a hospital and take in the sick. But charity moved him to do something for them and he opened his first center. Charity does not allow questions like, "Where, how, when, with what?" John came to Granada, he saw the sick and the poor abandoned in the streets and he found refuge for them in the hospital. Since then, his work has continued throughout history and will continue as long as his children are truly his children.

In no. 11, the Bull Spes Non Confundit invites us to be signs of hope to the sick. Through our closeness, our example, the holistic care that we offer to those who suffer, we send signs of hope to the many young people who live in a state of numbness and to those who are searching. The Bull states that, "care given to them (those who are in particularly difficult situations) is a hymn to human dignity, a song of hope that calls for the choral participation of society as a whole".

To sing, one must be in tune, one must open the door of one's heart to let others in and participate. It is also through this closeness that we are signs of hope to our brothers and sisters in the community, especially to those who suffer, "doing good and doing it well," following the example of our Founders.

Signs of hope are also needed by those who are the very embodiment of hope, namely, the young. Sadly, they often see their dreams and aspirations frustrated. We must not disappoint them, for the future depends on their enthusiasm. It is gratifying to see the energy they demonstrate, for example, by rolling up their sleeves and volunteering to help when disasters strike and people are in need. Yet it is sad to see young people who are without hope, who face an uncertain and unpromising future, who lack employment or job security, or realistic prospects after finishing school. Without the hope that their dreams can come true, they will inevitably grow discouraged and listless. Escaping into drugs, risk-taking and the pursuit of momentary pleasure does greater harm to them in particular, since it closes them to life's beauty and richness, and can lead to depression and even self-destructive actions. For this reason, the Jubilee should inspire the Church to make greater efforts to reach out to them. With renewed passion, let us demonstrate care and concern for adolescents, students and young couples, the rising generation. Let us draw close to the young, for they are the joy and hope of the Church and of the world

Monition

Signs of hope should also be present for migrants who leave their homelands behind in search of a better life for themselves and for their families. Their expectations must not be frustrated by prejudice and rejection. A spirit of welcome, which embraces everyone with respect for his or her dignity, should be accompanied by a sense of responsibility, lest anyone be denied the right to a dignified existence. Exiles, displaced persons and refugees, whom international tensions force to emigrate in order to avoid war, violence and discrimination, ought to be guaranteed security and access to employment and education, the means they need to find their place in a new social context.

May the Christian community always be prepared to defend the rights of those who are most vulnerable, opening wide its doors to welcome them, lest anyone ever be robbed of the hope of a better future. May the Lord's words in the great parable of the Last Judgement always find an echo in our hearts: "I was a stranger and you welcomed me" for "just as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you did it to me" (Mt 25:35.40).

Reflection



HOPE, A DIGNIFIED LIFE FOR THE POOR.

SUNDAY 11

Monition

I ask with all my heart that hope be granted to the billions of the poor, who often lack the essentials of life. Before the constant tide of new forms of impoverishment, we can easily grow inured and resigned. Yet we must not close our eyes to the dramatic situations that we now encounter all around us, not only in certain parts of the world. Each day we meet people who are poor or impoverished; they may even be our next-door neighbours. Often they are homeless or lack sufficient food for the day. They suffer from exclusion and indifference on the part of many. It is scandalous that in a world possessed of immense resources, destined largely to producing weapons, the poor continue to be "the majority of the planet's population, billions of people. These days they are mentioned in international political and economic discussions, but one often has the impression that their problems are brought up as an afterthought, a question which gets added almost out of duty or in a tangential way, if not treated merely as collateral damage. Indeed, when all is said and done, they frequently remain at the bottom of the pile". Let us not forget: the poor are almost always the victims, not the ones to blame.

Echoing the age-old message of the prophets, the Jubilee reminds us that the goods of the earth are not destined for a privileged few, but for everyone. The rich must be generous and not avert their eyes from the faces of their brothers and sisters in need. Here I think especially of those who lack water and food: hunger is a scandal, an open wound on the body of our humanity, and it summons all of us to a serious examination of conscience.

Firewood alone costs seven or eight reales a day, because the city is large and very cold, especially now in winter, many poor people come to this House of God. Between all of us, sick and healthy, staff and pilgrims, there are more than one hundred and ten here.

Reflection

MAY

In chapter 8, the Gospel of Mark tells us that Jesus had compassion on those who had nothing to eat (v. 2). At the same time, it shows how the sharing of bread on that occasion became a cause of confusion and division (v. 14-18). The same thing is happening with the poor in today's world. Many develop models of care and collaboration that unfortunately remain dead letter. Others debate the relevance and cost of their implementation. Others yet take it upon themselves to make their presence felt with simple gestures, such as a smile, which show that there is still hope, even in the midst of difficulties and hardship.

The community of the Novitiate of Saint Richard Pampuri strives to live out the two-fold dimension of Christian spirituality: "But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the rerason for the hope that you have" (1 Peter 3:15). For decades, the Saint Benedict Menni Center in Soacha, Cundinamarca, has been a visible and effective presence in the face of exclusion and indifference toward the most vulnerable.

We grow together (patients and brothers) to avoid hypocrisy, legalism and superficiality (the leaven of the Pharisees. v. 15), which also impoverish the spirit. To be signs of hope involves having solidarity for one's own shortcomings. That is why we are concerned about material and spiritual poverty, responding to the Lord's constant call not to be indifferent to suffering. Encouraging and nourishing hope begins with the wonderful gift of genuine joy, and mutual welcome (hospitality) to wounded humanity which is looking for a gaze, a gesture, an embrace; even just a word that can heal it (Mt 8:8) and give it dignity.
