Biblical text

Charismatic text

In what moments of my daily life, in what aspects of my spiritual life, do I recognise myself as most in need of a living, renewed hope?

Biblical text:

Charismatic text:

As Hospitallers, we strive to embody ever more deeply Christ's feelings towards the sick and needy (...) we assist them as the beloved of the Kingdom; we proclaim to them the love of the Father and the mystery of his total salvation. (Const. OH n.3)

For our reflection:

Christian missionary identity is lived out in everyday life: in gestures of tenderness, in patient listening, in closeness to those who suffer.

For us as hospitallers, this mission has a face. How do I show closeness and compassion to the sick, the needy, my colleagues, and my brothers and sisters in the community?













REKINDLING HOPE IN A WORLD OVERWHELMED BY DENSE SHADOWS

Biblical text

'The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who lived in the land of shadows, a light has shone'. (Isaiah 9:1)

Charismatic text

This letter is to let you know how passionate I am and how much I need, thanks to our Lord Jesus Christ, for all of this. Because you must know that there are so many poor people who come here that I myself am often amazed at how they can be sustained, but Jesus Christ foresees everything. (Letter from John of God to Gutierrez Laso)

For our reflection:

In the face of the human crisis we are experiencing today, how can we become these beacons of hope and restorers of a humanity that is often distracted and unhappy?













CONTINUING JESUS' MINISTRY OF HOPE

Encouraged by such great hope, Christian communities can be signs of a new humanity in a world that, in the most 'developed' areas, shows serious symptoms of a crisis of humanity: a widespread feeling of disorientation, loneliness and abandonment of the elderly; difficulty in being available to help those around us. (Pope's Message for the 99th World Mission Day 2025).

Biblical text:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour. (Luke 4:18-19)

"MAY THE LORD BE GRACIOUS AND BLESS US; MAY HE MAKE HIS FACE SHINE UPON US; MAY THE EARTH KNOW YOUR WAYS, ALL PEOPLES YOUR SALVATION" PSALM: PSALM 67(66):2-3

Charismatic text

New situations of poverty and marginalisation, associated with psychological suffering, call for compassionate sensitivity and prophetic boldness towards new areas of mission, building a 'common home' based on hospitality in an intercultural and global world. (XXII C.G. HSC pg. 39)

For our reflection:

As Hospitallers, our way of caring is to follow in the footsteps of the Good Samaritan; how do I allow myself to be challenged by new situations of poverty so as not to fall into indifference?











HOSPITALITY: GOD'S STYLE

The hope we have received from God can be offered with simplicity (cf. 1 Peter 1:21), bringing to others the same comfort with which we have been comforted by God. (...)
"We have been sent to continue this mission: to be a sign of the Heart of Christ and the love of the Father, embracing the whole world.

Biblical text:

"He comforts us in all our afflictions, so that we may be able to comfort others".

Charismatic text

Through our charism, we are called to be witnesses of God's infinite mercy, embodying hospitality, carrying out Jesus' command to 'go and do likewise' and collaborating in the building of the Kingdom. (HSC Const. n. 3)

For our reflection:

Pope Francis invites us to drink from the source: the Heart of Christ, which 'is the living centre of the first announcement'. Can I say that the source of my hope is the Heart of Christ? What is my basis for saying this?













WELCOMING THE CRY OF HUMANITY: WALKING WITH THE LORD ON THE ROADS OF THE WORLD

Biblical Text

Have I not commanded you to be brave and steadfast? Do not be afraid, do not be dismayed, for Yahweh your God will be with you wherever you go. (Joshua 1:9)

"WAIT FOR GOD, YOU WILL PRAISE HIM AGAIN" PSALM 42(41):6

Charismatic text

Our hospitable community is born and grows from the love that the Holy Spirit instils in our hearts (68). Its centre is the risen Lord, in whose name we gather to walk together towards the Father and communicate to men GS 1 the good news of salvation. (Const. OH n. 26)

For our reflection:

Our mission takes us to the wounded heart of each person. How do I welcome and listen to others? Can I say that I am available?













BE ARTISANS OF HOPE

Today, faced with the urgency of the mission of hope, Christ's disciples are called first and foremost to form themselves, to be 'artisans' of hope and restorers of humanity. (...)

Let us renew the mission of hope, beginning with prayer.

Biblical Text

"Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word". (Lk 1:38)

"GOD IS IN THE MIDST OF HER; SHE SHALL NOT BE MOVED" PSALM 46(45):6

Charismatic text

Sharing the same charism makes us a family in which we celebrate our faith, feel and live as brothers and sisters, and fulfil our common mission of serving the sick and needy.

For our reflection:

What specific inspirations have I received during this missionary week of prayer?
